### PARENTS:

God's mercy is a thread weaving through each chapter as, over and over, God's people are given the opposite of what we deserve. We pray that you and your children will experience His mercy in new and extraordinary ways this Christmas season.

### **AT-HOME ACTIVITIES:**

- Bake Christmas cookies with your child. Select cookie cutters that encourage conversation about God's attributes, especially His mercy. For example, an angel cookie can remind us that in His mercy, God sent messengers to tell shepherds the Good News of Christ's arrival. A heart-shaped cookie can also help us remember that God loves us even when we fail Him. Let the children come up with their ideas. You may be surprised at how God is speaking to them!
- Invite your child to help you wrap gifts. As you work, ask how gift-giving can be an act of mercy. (Mercy means "not getting what you deserve.") Before you clean up, pray for everyone who will receive your gifts.
