## Purpose

Have you ever looked at your life and wondered, “What am I here for?” You’re not alone. Every woman—whether a mother, wife, businesswoman, student, or ministry leader—has moments of uncertainty. But here’s the truth: God doesn’t make mistakes. You were born on purpose, with purpose, for purpose. Even in mundane or messy seasons, your life carries Kingdom significance. Esther didn’t know that her moment of courage would change history, yet she stepped forward “for such a time as this”. (Esther 4:14). And so can you.

### 1) Know Who You Are in Christ

*“But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light” 1 Peter 2:9*

Walking in purpose begins with identity. If you don’t know who you are, the world will try to tell you. And often, it tells you that you’re not enough, too broken, too late, too small. But God’s Word tells a different story. You are not random or

forgotten. You are chosen, beloved, royal, and redeemed. Your past doesn't disqualify you; it's the canvas where God paints redemption. Purpose is less about what you do and more about who you are in Him. When you know your worth in Christ, you stop striving for approval and start walking in divine confidence.

## 2) Stay Connected to the Source

*"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit..."* **John 15:5**

Purpose doesn't grow in isolation—it flourishes through intimacy with Jesus. Just like a branch can't survive without the vine, you can't walk in lasting purpose without remaining connected to your Source. When you're deeply rooted in God's presence through prayer, worship, and reading His Word, He reveals His plans step by step. It's not about figuring everything out at once; it's about trusting that your Shepherd knows the way.

And in dry seasons when you don't feel His nearness, your consistency in staying connected keeps your purpose alive and growing. Fruit takes time, but staying close to Jesus guarantees a harvest.

## 3) Walk in Faith, Not in Fear

*"For we live by faith, not by sight."* **2 Corinthians 5:7**

Fear is often the loudest voice when you're about to step into your purpose. It whispers lies like, "You're not qualified," or "What if you fail?" But God calls you to walk by faith, not by what you see, feel, or fear. Purpose requires trust. It's stepping out of the boat when the waves still look wild. It's saying yes when you don't have the full picture. It's believing that if God calls you, He will equip you.

Courage doesn't mean you're never afraid—it means you move forward anyway, knowing God is with you. Every act of faith, no matter how small, is a seed that will bear fruit in time.

## Call to Action

- 1.) Write down 3 Scriptures that remind you of your identity in Christ. Speak them out loud daily until they’re etched into your heart.
- 2.) Write down one area where God is nudging you to take a bold step. Pray over it, seek wisdom, and then take that next step—even if it feels uncomfortable.

**Commit to trusting the Lord and walking in your God-given purpose. Strive to silence distraction and follow Jesus.**
