The Bible never separates truth from manhood. From Genesis to Revelation, God consistently calls men to:

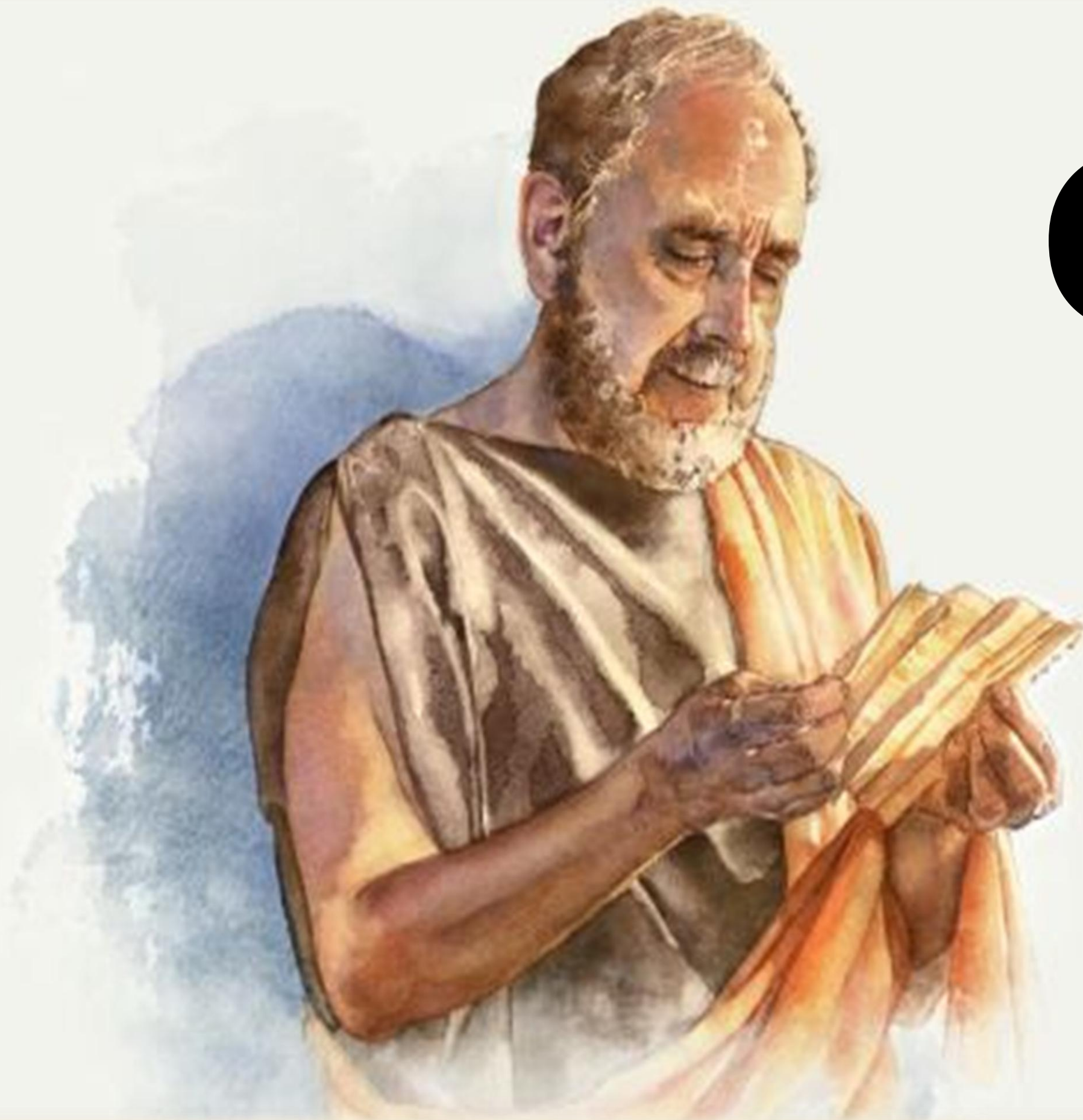

Greeting to Gaius

1 The Elder,

To the beloved Gaius, whom *I love in truth*:



2 Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers. **3** For I rejoiced greatly when brethren came and *testified of the truth that is in you*, just as you *walk in the truth*. **4** I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.

The Beloved Friend (vv. 1-2)

- **A relationship grounded in truth**
- **A fellowship marked by genuine affection**
- **A prayer for spiritual and physical prosperity**

The Blessed Report (v. 3)

- **The testimony of others**
- **The truth was truly within him**
- **He walked in the truth**

Convictions that are biblical

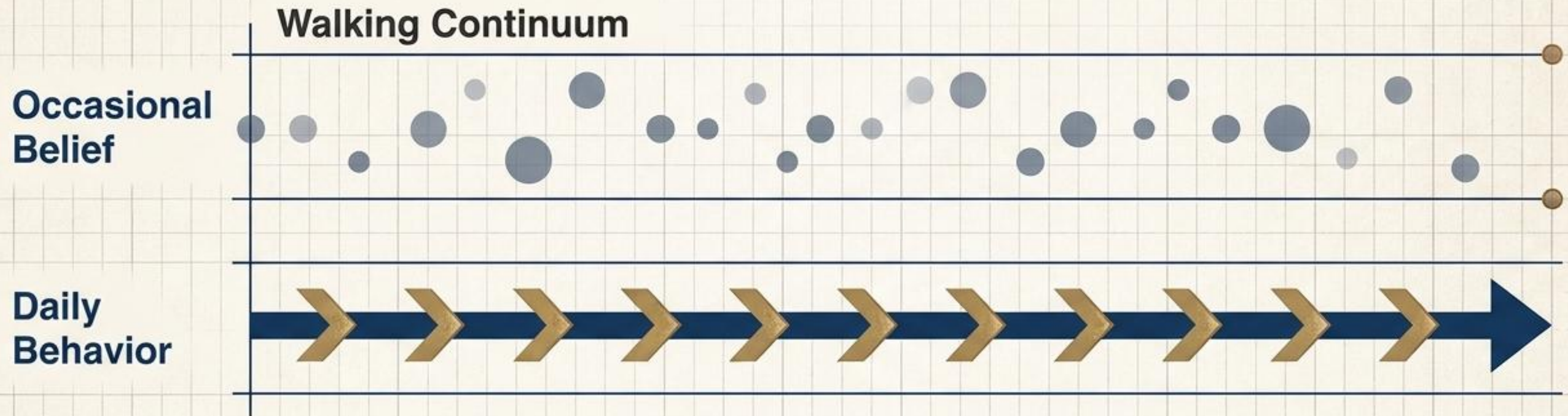
Hearts that are surrendered

A compass without true north misleads.

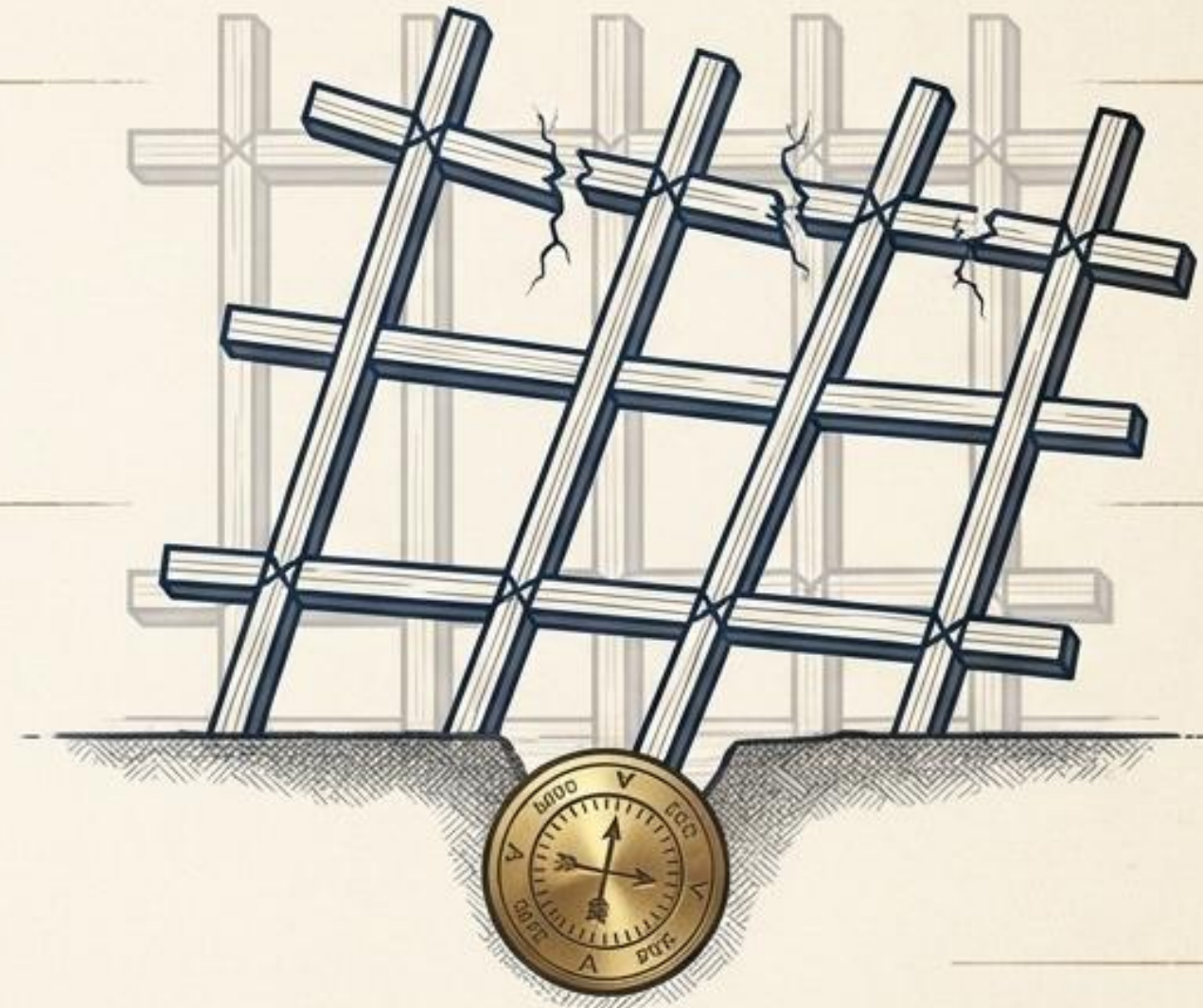
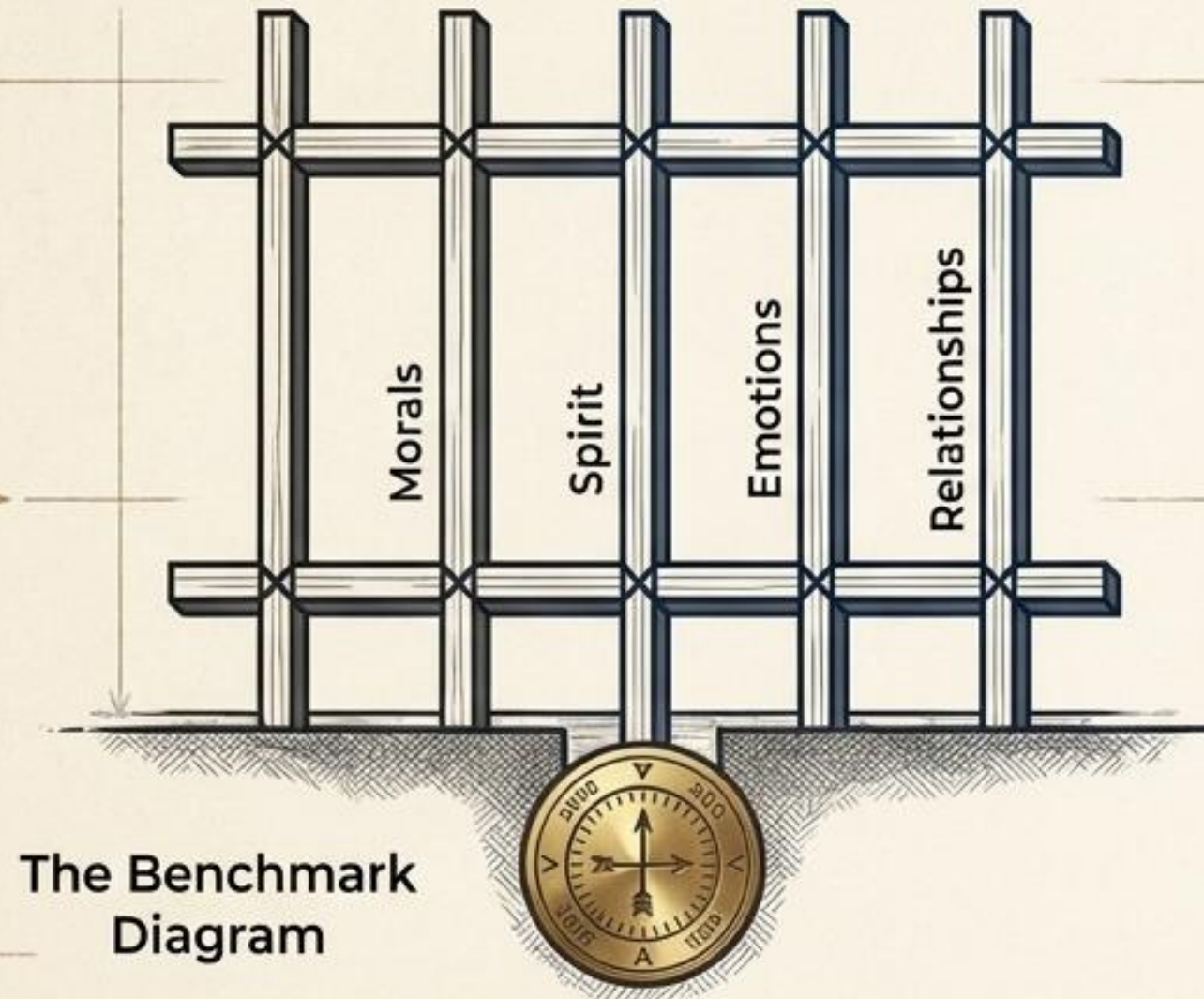


A life without truth self-destructs.

Truth is not a trend. Truth is a Person.

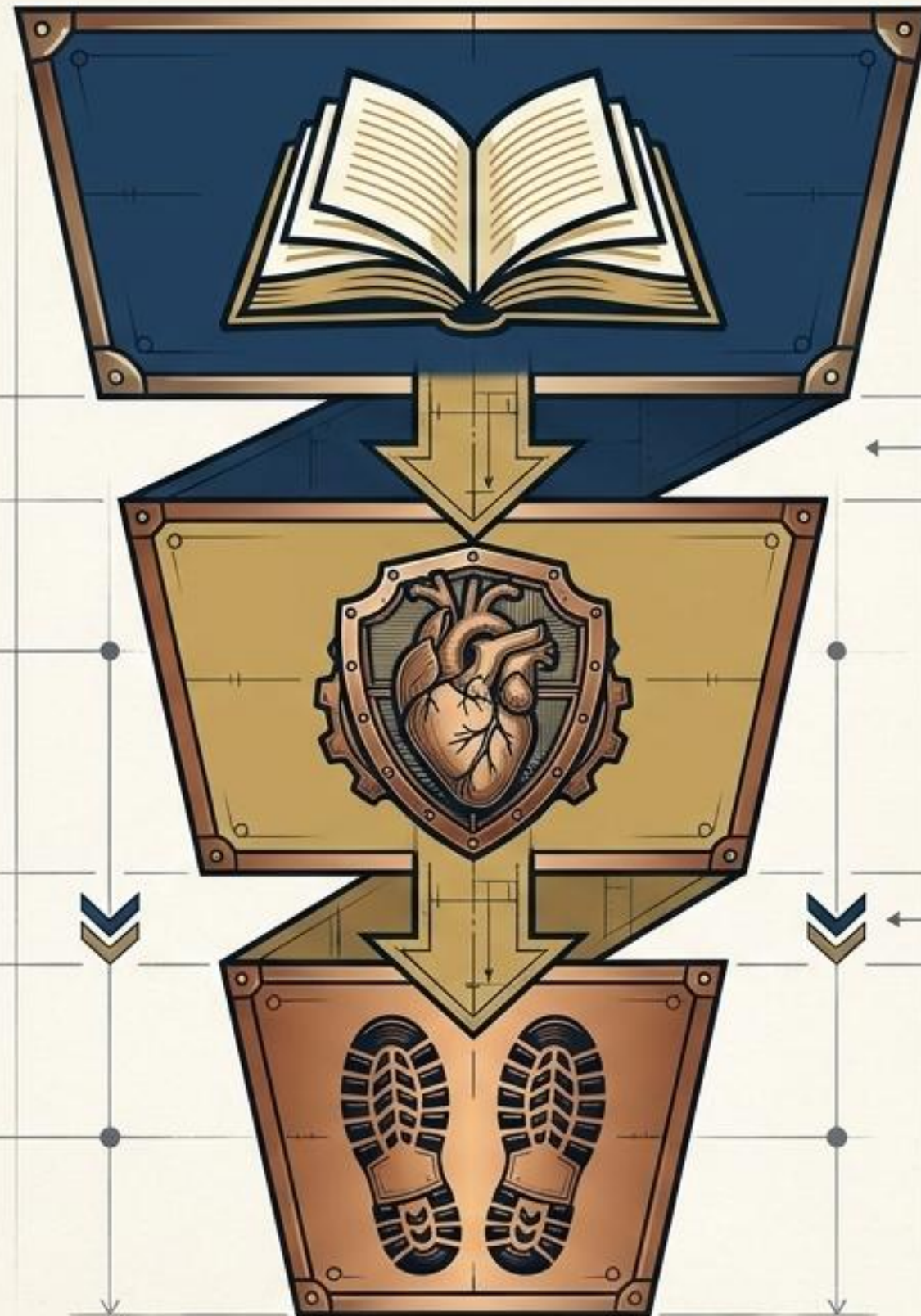
The Structural Benchmark

When construction crews prepare a site, surveyors establish reference markers called benchmarks. Every wall and beam must align with those fixed points.



God's Word is the benchmark for a man's life. If a father neglects this fixed point, he will eventually drift morally, spiritually, emotionally, and relationally.

The Anatomy of Integrity



LEARNED (Head/Mind)

Men are not born truthful;
convictions are formed by the Word.

Thy word is true from the beginning. (Psalm 119:160)



LOVED (Heart)

Truth cannot merely sit in the head;
it must settle in the heart.

They received not the love of the truth. (2 Thess 2:10)



LIVED (Hands & Feet)

Anyone can quote Scripture. But
the real question is: Does your
lifestyle validate your testimony?

preached behind a pulpit. It is preached:

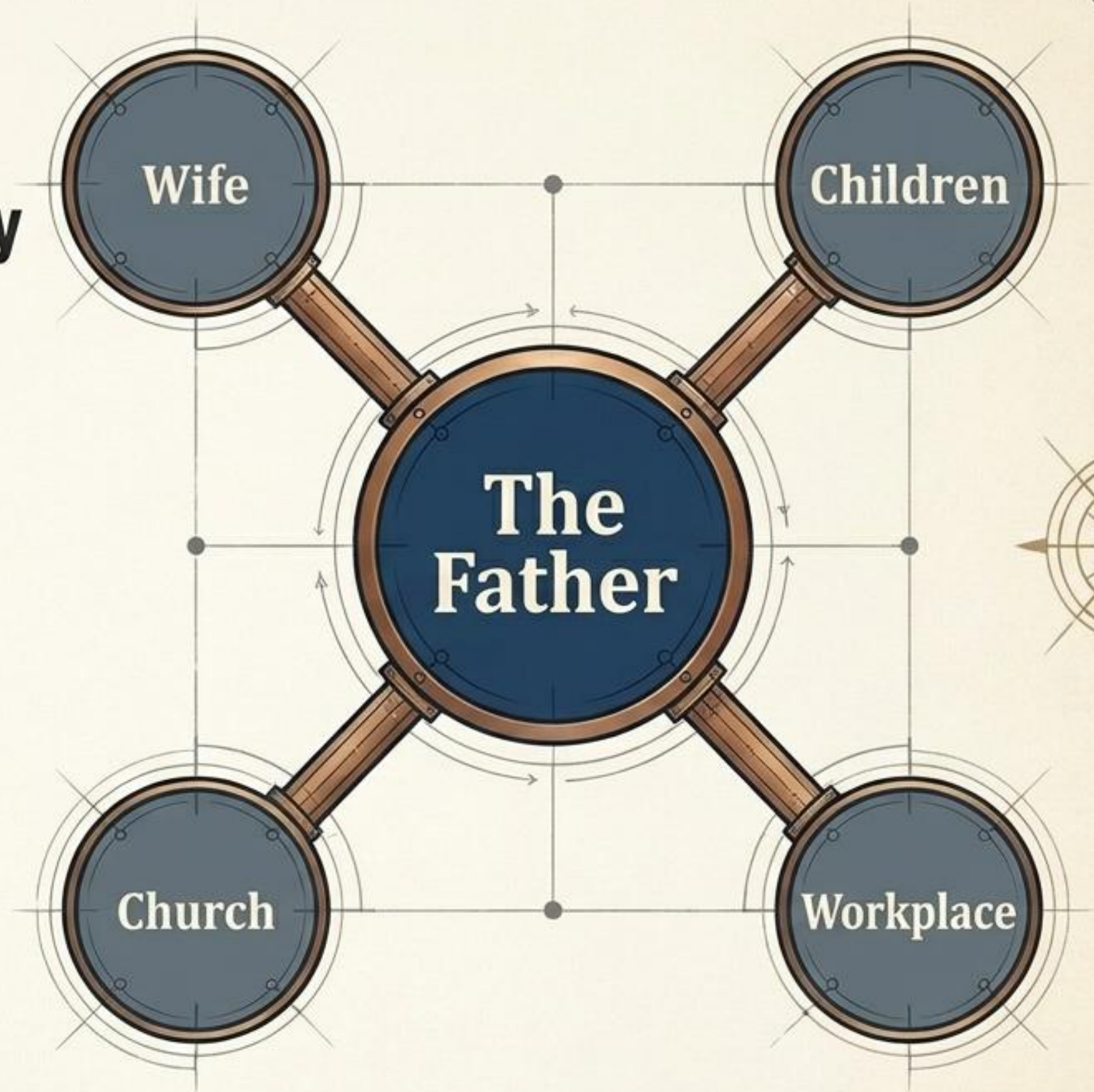
At the dinner table

In the workplace

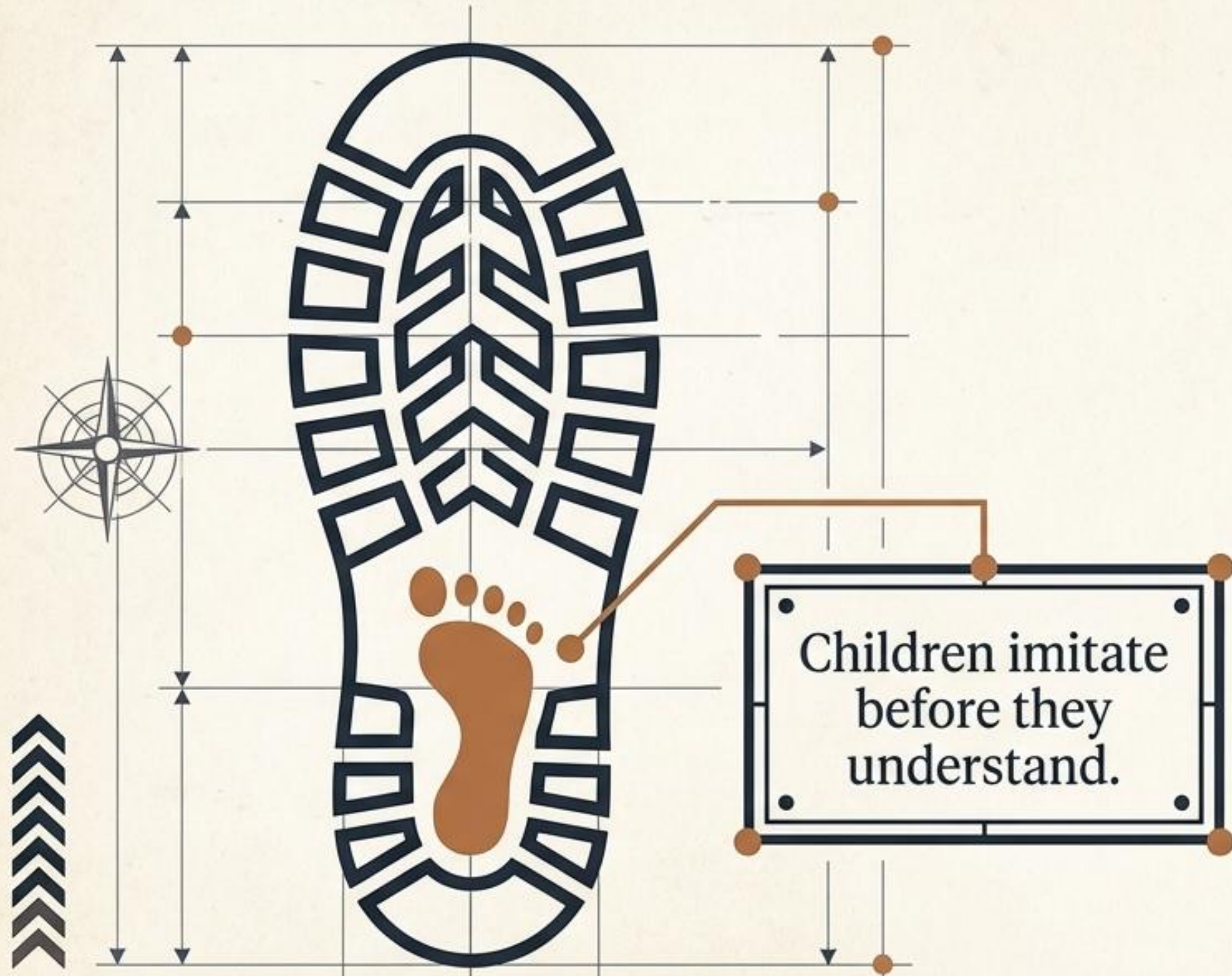
During conflict

The Mechanics of Legacy

Private Integrity
(Monday-Saturday consistency)

You are the same person privately that you appear to be publicly.

Public Credibility
(Authenticity without hypocrisy)

Your family can survive your mistakes. They cannot survive your hypocrisy.

Generational Blessing
(Impact on children)

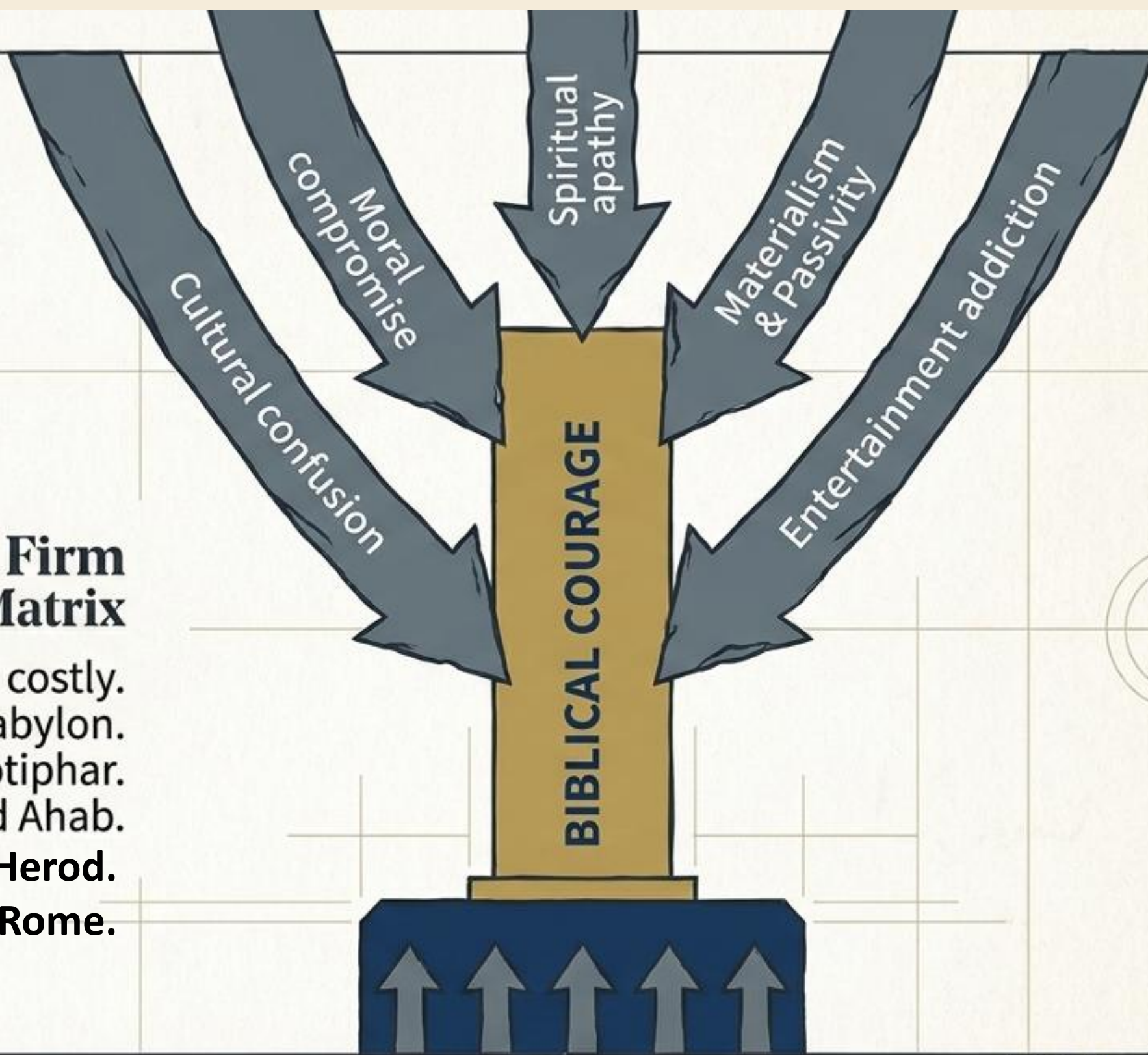
The just man walketh in his integrity: his children are blessed after him. — Proverbs 20:7

The Ultimate Audience

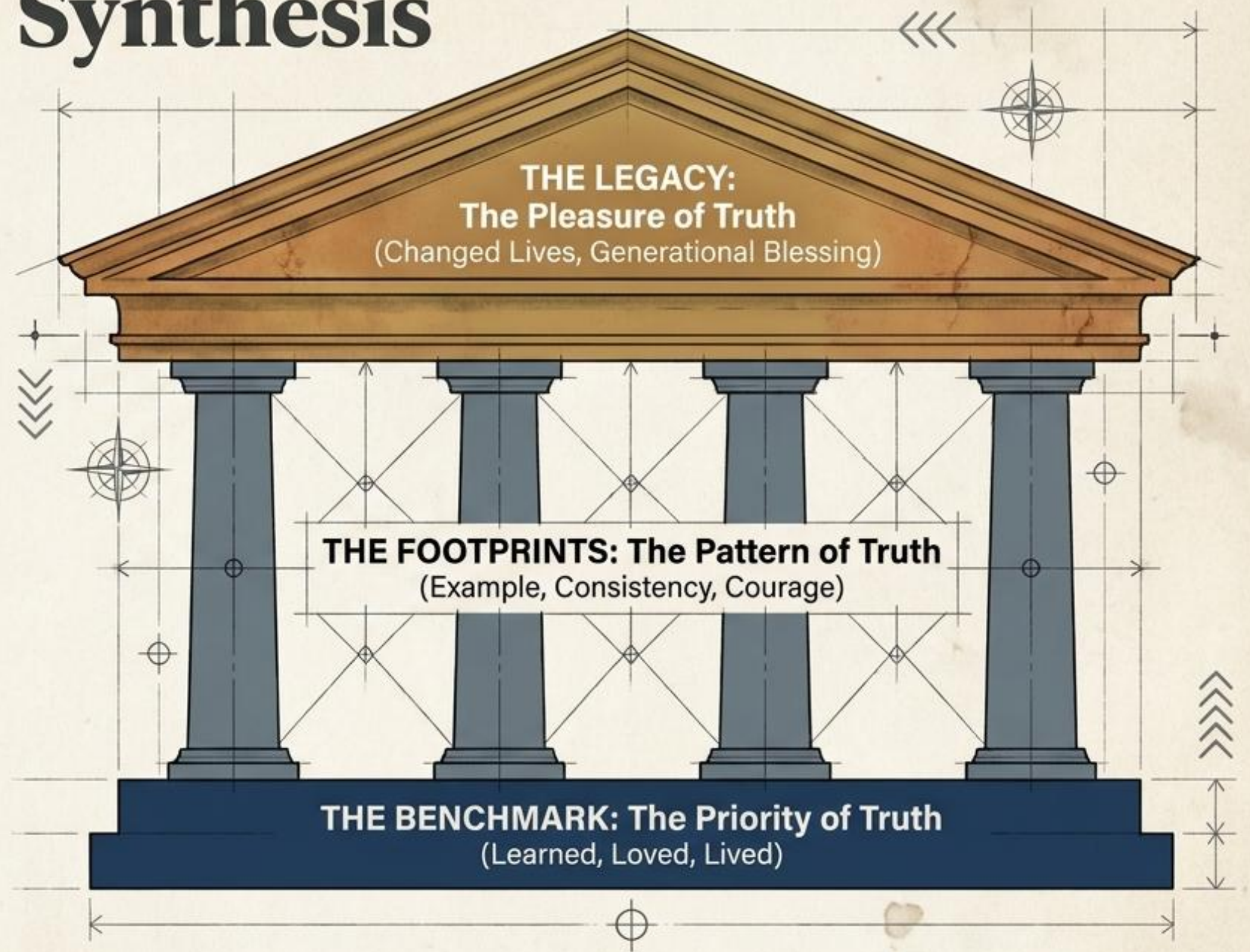
One day, every man will
