5-9 Who do you think Paul is, anyway? Or Apollos, for that matter? Servants, both of us—servants who waited on you as you gradually learned to entrust your lives to our mutual Master. We each carried out our servant assignment. I planted the seed, Apollos watered the plants, but God made you grow. It's not the one who plants or the one who waters who is at the center of this process but God, who makes things grow. Planting and watering are menial servant jobs at minimum wages. What makes them worth doing is the God we are serving. You happen to be God's field in which we are working.





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

### Martin of Tours

### **Martin of Tours:**



- Forced into the Roman army Petitioned to be released from army because "I am Christ's soldier: I am not allowed to fight."
- Offered to stand in front of battle line armed with sign of the cross
- Imprisoned but was soon discharged

Legend holds Martin cut his cloak in half to share with a beggar. He dreamed that Jesus himself was clothed with the torn cloak. When he awoke, the garment was restored.

- Conclusion-the neighbor figure in the parable is the one who shows mercy to their fellow man.

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### Understanding the History of Chaplains

- > A chaplain was an ordained member of the Roman Catholic clergy assigned to a special ministry such as guarding relics.
- > One such relic was Saint Martin's famous half cape (Capella in French).
- ➤ Chaplains were appointed by kings as guardians of the chapel.





### Modern Definitions of Chaplains

As previously mentioned:

- A chaplain in current terms, is a clergyperson who is appointed to bring the chapel (the church) to secular culture and institutions.
- A chaplain is a minister who represents the presence and interest of God in community and crisis.



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## Understanding the differences among paid career Chaplains and COH

- √ Career Chaplain A paid position with extensive requirements
- ✓ Professional Chaplain Usually requires master's or PHD
- ✓ Military Chaplain Most stringent Master's Degree
- Exceptions: Some prisons, jails, hospitals, nursing homes and other organizations may allow volunteer local chaplains with experience and some credentials.



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### COH or a Local Chaplain

- Committed to working with religious or community agency
- Committed to being God's response to struggling, discouraged individuals and communities
- Partner with local churches to provide support and assistance in reaching "the least of these" in the name of Christ



## Local Chaplains of Hope are the Gospel in action

- ❖ Also thought of as a domestic Chaplain
- Called to serve in a local area, usually a community that is struggling spiritually, economically, educationally and/or socially.
- Embracing the Biblical truths of Jesus and allowing the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to serve as the motivation and foundation of our efforts.

- ✓ The Church should always be offering stability in our communities.
- ✓ The Church is called to PRAY.
- ✓ Our communities are desperate;

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## Mandate and Biblical Principles for Helping Others in Need

### Why Should we help Others:

- · God cares deeply for the suffering
- · The poor and disenfranchised need our help
- Failure to help others will bring Judgement (Matthew 25)
- ✓ Over 2000 verses in the Bible reference helping others caught in poverty and injustice
- √ The word "poor" is used 200 times in the NT alone.

"Is this not the **fast that I have chosen**: To loose the bonds of wickedness, To undo the heavy burdens, To let the oppressed go free, And that you break every yoke?

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### Why Every Community Needs a COH

- 1. Today's communities have extreme diversity
- 2. The Church has unfortunately failed to meet community needs
- 3. Domestic homes that are fragmented and needy
- 4. Poorly constructed education systems
- 5. Weakening family and community values



### Why Every Community Needs a COH

- 6. Continuing dependence on government programs
- 7. Churches and believers (with means) are moving away from it being their responsibility
- 8. Breakdown of family structure / fatherlessness
- 9. The Struggle of youth to find HOPE
- 10. The Electronic Hypnosis of the internet, media, phones

It's not your idea's and Its not your IQ It's your willingness to be available and serve

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### Play The Role of a COH

- √ From the role of a Disciple, to a Community COH
- ✓ Not just content to be a Christian, but a Community Servant
- ✓ Not just going to church, but becoming the church
- Be part of God's response with a role to play. God Has "others," others who are capable & trained in specific areas with skills you do not have.

Build Community Relationships & Work Together!



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### Bring Hope and Help to the Hurting

- Your role as a Local Chaplain is how you respond to God's call on your life and the fact you bring <u>HOPE</u> & <u>HELP</u> to those without the ability to help themselves
- Fulfill His will as you serve and bring a godly response to the hurting and hopeless in your neighborhood



## 10 Reasons having a COH on the Leadership <u>Team</u> can be beneficial to both <u>Pastor &</u> Health of the Church

- 1. Knowing the pulse of the community
- 2. Expanding the Pastors vision for the community
- 3. Generates and outward missional focus
- 4. Represents the church to community and community to the church
- 5. Engages the church in real-life



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## 10 Reasons having a COH on the <u>Leadership</u> <u>Team</u> can be beneficial to both <u>Pastor</u> & <u>Health of the Church</u>

- 6. Causes us to recruit the "Great Commandment & Great Commission"
- 7. Connects the church with county, city, community life and influencers
- 8. Helps the church identify the real needs over perceived needs
- 9. Creates a ministry pipeline/Timothy process/avenue for many to get involved
- 10. Helps unify the community



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### Specific ways a Chaplain may serve

- ✓ What they do, depends on what they are. Depending upon background, education, life skills, etc...
- Some community outreaches may focus on feeding and clothing the poor or providing other basic needs, but this should not be the only job of a COH.
- ✓ New options are birthing daily at the <u>Speed of</u> <u>Community Maturity or Decay</u>
  - ✓ Example Foster Children who are aged out.



### What Matters Most As A COH

- Jesus showed us what we are called to do & how to do it!
- He established His Church to carry out that work with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Carry HOPE to the hurting and let the Holy Spirit guide you into all things.

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### Why is Offering HOPE to the Hopeless so Life-Changing?

Messengers of HOPE should always be a first response. *Why is this important?* 

- ✓ Always be poor people just like there will always be sick people. Jesus came to "preach the Good News to the poor," (Luke 4:17, 7:22-23)
- √ "As I freely give, so must you." (Matt 10:8) Poor are DEAR to His heart & should be dear to us
- ✓ May not have finances on hand or other resources necessary for each person's immediate need – <u>Wallet</u> of Hope

Our HOPE is in Him, never in ourselves, our abilities, or resources.



## What is the Biblical Perspective on Poor and Poverty

- ✓ Poverty is said to be a product of the fallen world.
- ✓ God not opposed to wealth, rich are often snared by prosperity.
  - Gleaning the Fields Duet. 24:19-21 (Book of Ruth)
  - Temporary Slavery Deut. 15:12-14
  - · Year of Jubilee Lev. 25:11-12



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### **Poverty**

What does poverty look like today & how does it affect people?

- > The extent to which an individual does without resources to meet critical needs Emotional/Physical/Educational is poverty
- As a COH we believe that poor communities tend to be rich, in undiagnosed problems (opportunities) and leadership vacuums (developing leaders).



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## Facts to Focus Poverty Has Been Described As:

- An empty heart /broken relationships
- Inferiority-not knowing your gifts, strengths, abilities
- Powerlessness-not being able to make progress
- Isolation Hopelessness no <u>HOPE</u> or belief in yourself, no way to help your family
- Not knowing God
- · Not having the basics
- Lack of good thoughts Negativity, Bad thinking



### The Poor in America

### Who are the poor in America?


- ✓ Numbers have dropped consistently since peaking at 15.1% in 2015, there are still 11.1% or 36.8 million people living in poverty in the US as of 2023.
- ✓ Poor can be described as often times not having enough for the basics.

Translates into 1 of every 9 people in the USA.

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## Poverty/Poor maybe the result of sin and is either Situational or Generational

- ✓ Oppressed by other people/governments
- √ External calamities/loss of job
- ✓ Moral failures/gambling/foolish spending
- √ Addictions
- √ Generational poor/accepted way of life
- ✓ Your clan or tribe
- ✓ Living in a fallen world



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### The Many Problems Facing Those Trapped in Poverty or Hopeless Situations

### What they worry about:

- ✓ Making the money I do have, go farther
- ✓ Cutting corners
- ✓ Transportation to and from all things
- ✓ Getting too old to fight for survival any more
- ✓ What if I get sick
- ✓ What are my priorities
- ✓ How to trust God with my little



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### The Less Resources Available, the Greater the Risk of Falling into or Staying in Poverty

- Financial money to purchase goods and services
- Emotional stamina, perseverance, and acquired
- ❖ Mental- intellectual ability and acquired skills
- \* **Spiritual** belief in divine purpose & guidance (HOPE)
- Physical health and mobility
- \* <u>Support Systems</u>- friends, family, backup resources
- \* Role needs- frequent access to positive helpful people
- \* Knowledge of hidden rules



### Opportunity or Problems?

The Inability to see beyond the present ...
No hope or plan for the tomorrows

Lack of understanding/planning/preparing

COH helping to meet physical/ felt/real needs

Jesus came to preach the Good News
to the poor! He is the Answer!

- ✓ Not all poor people are unhappy!
- ✓ Poverty and being poor are not the same thing!
- ✓ Ruby Payne's Exercise

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### Ruby Payne's - The Culture of Poverty

Based on a racialized "culture of poverty" model that attributes the failure of the poor (poverty) to their lack of middle-class behavior.

Public school teachers who are from the middle class often struggle to understand or relate to their students from poverty backgrounds.



### Ruby Payne's - Understanding Poverty

In A Framework for Understanding Poverty, Payne asks her readers, to take her "Could you survive?" quizzes.

- √ Home Work from last tonight
- ✓ Ask Yourself Two Questions:
  - Could You Accept it? OR Do you Reject it?
  - Are people locked into poverty because they don't know secrets to the next level?

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# A Field Survey - Tells the Story! When working with both individuals & groups, the following steps are a great starting point: > What is the need/crisis? > What is the desired outcome? > How can I help you achieve that? > Use a small number of Questions! Do the "leg work" and Don't be afraid to try again, and again, etc...

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# The COH survey model for identifying and responding to needs is slightly different Simple surveys completed by those involved in needed areas, will help directly impacted what the "real" needs are vs "perceived" needs



- 5. Help those directly in your path (good Samaritan)



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
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


- Action Plans can serve as a template for others to follow.
- Each Action Plan should include a Mission Statement (a clear vision of the top priorities).
- Practice sharing your action plan and Mission Statement and get it down where you can share it quickly.


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

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### A Must For a COH

- ✓ Have a personal growing relationship with Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 18-20)
- ✓ Must be a Christian follower of Jesus & His teaching of Reconciliation
- ✓ Must ourselves know & be growing in that relationship



### **COH CORE VALUES**

- Being a Christian is about learning to see world as lesus does
- > As believers, carry His words of <u>HOPE</u> in mouths & His practical help in hands
- Must be genuine. Talk must match walk if are going to earn trust of those trying to help



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### Self-Support For A COH

- ✓ God has a field of labor for everyone, regardless of any inadequacies you may be experiencing.
   Esther 4:14.
- √ No person is entitled to their own truth. The Bible is only sure truth for knowing Him & His will.
- ✓ Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth and teach all things (John 16:13) and will help us remember what we need to do.



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### A COH has a Calming Effect on Others

### Ministry of Presence:

A COH ministers mostly to those outside church or at time without influence of local church

### Ministry of Sight:

A COH must maintain constant fellowship with church if wish to avoid pitfalls that await ministry in secular environment



### **Best Practices**

### Willingness to Respect ...

- Recognize that some people may not desire anything more than practical assistance
- Forcing religious views upon them will be offensive, resented & limit ability to function as effective COH



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### Support For A COH Works Both Ways

Once the Pastor/leadership is confident in the COH calling, church should honor them

COH must continue to submit to the authority of the local church and vision of the Pastor. Goal of COH is to never establish independent ministry

If at any time the pastor becomes non-supportive, do not show disrespect



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### COH CORE VALUES

- Know how beneficial services can be to overworked Pastor
- Can be the eyes & ears of what's happening outside the church
- Church leadership great provider of spiritual advice-There is safety in a multitude of counselors



## Those Closest to the Problem Have the Potential to Do the Best Job Dealing With It!

- Government programs serve to sustain someone in poverty than create a pathway out
- There is no model in Scripture for government be engaged in welfare programs or anything that prohibits it

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### Develop a Chaplains Heart

### Jesus never focused on personal survival:

- · He knew His destiny & confident in His future
- He came to establish like confidence in hearts of humanity
- COH must die to self & live steadfastly in same HOPE as Jesus modeled



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## Those Closest to the Problem Have the Potential to Do the Best Job Dealing With It!

### Justice:

- Church mandated to speak out on behalf of those being treated unfairly
- God never intended that there be poor & suffering among His people. Deut 15:4, Pro. 31:8-9

### Maturity of Life Experience

Desperate people need **HOPE**, it would not be unusual for God to direct you to those who are dealing with difficult challenges similar to the ones you have faced.

Sharing similar situations can strengthen your understanding. Divine appointments often occur.



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### Maturity of Life Experience

If past failures no longer hold you back, you can use them to encourage others who also feel defeated.

COH are primarily "first responders." A ministry of comfort & assistance for those in distress

COH are not counselors or long- term therapists & should NEVER allow selves to fall into these roles.

### Willingness to learn ...

- ✓ Taking time to learn about different cultures & ethnicities demonstrates sincere interest & prepares to better serve
- ✓ In God's heart, there are only souls, regardless of ...
- As His representative, interaction with those with different values & belief systems must always be respectful & loving

- > Job shadow when possible Be in Relationship
- > READ, READ, READ Books on urgency of church getting outside of the walls to help community
- > Attend meetings concerning issues that affect the community
- > Take additional Courses
