






Bethelpara Amoi









Thelpathar








Dhobiakura








Koldiha








Roma








Kalamati








Elwapathar



IPHC Ministry in Andaman

We praise God for opening doors for IPHC to reach the Andaman Islands for the very first time. On our first day, we had the privilege of meeting with 55 local leaders in Port Blair for a powerful time of fellowship and ministry. Bishop Raven and Rev. Ashok Mishra delivered impactful sermons, while Rev. Jesan shared the vision of the IPHC ministry, particularly the "Building Together" initiative. The leaders were deeply moved as they learned how God is using IPHC to bring transformation to the region.

Our visit also included a trip to the historic Cellular Jail in Port Blair, a somber reminder of India's struggle for independence. The jail, completed in 1906, houses 696 cells, and we had the opportunity to stand in the room where 173 prisoners were hanged. Located on the beach, the jail stands as a testament to the sacrifices made by those who suffered and died here for our freedom.

We thanked God for the independence we enjoy today, remembering the bravery of those who gave their lives for our precious motherland. As we reflected on these historical events, we also pondered the greater freedom we have in Christ. Through the sacrifice of His Son, we have been liberated from the prison of sin and death and granted eternal life.

We prayed for the people of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, asking for God's glory to descend upon them. May God's blessings continue to pour over India.

In the evening, we were invited to minister at Miracle Church in Salve, located on another island. It was a time of great blessing and spiritual renewal.

On the second day, our journey began early at 3 AM. After catching the bus at 4 AM from Port Blair, we set out for North Andaman, knowing that it would be a long journey. Although the distance was only 300 km, the road conditions proved to be challenging, and it took us 13 hours to reach Diglipur in North Andaman. By God's grace, we arrived safely at 5 PM, though exhausted from the journey.

Diglipur holds a special place in our hearts as the home of Pr. Pravin Khalko, our contact person in Andaman. Pr. Pravin is from IPHC Namkom, Ranchi, a place known for raising strong leaders for God's kingdom. We thank God for the ministry of our former General Superintendent, Bishop P. S. Dahanga, who has played a key role in raising leaders like Pr. Pravin.

Equipping the Called for Kingdom Impact

Beyond Borders Training Center (BBTC) is a ministry of IPHC North India that dedicated to equipping leaders and transforming communities. At its heart, BBTC strives to raise up God-fearing leaders who will bring hope to unreached regions.

A Place of Growth and Purpose

BBTC is more than a training center—it is a spiritual family. Here, participants are mentored and supported as they grow into the leaders God has called them to be.

Comprehensive Training Programs

Every year, BBTC offers two intensive training programs:

- Men's Training Course: September to December.
- Women's Training Course: March to June.

The curriculum for these courses is built around three pillars:

 Bible Training and Leadership Development: Participants gain a deep understanding of Scripture and practical leadership skills to disciple others effectively.

- 2. Hands-On Ministry Experience: Weekly outreaches to nearby villages and towns allow trainees to engage in relational ministry.
- 3. Vocational Training: Men receive training in welding, computer skills, guitar, and English, while women learn tailoring, baking, computer literacy, and English. These practical skills not only empower participants to sustain their livelihoods but also open new avenues for ministry.
