INTRODUCTION



Since its inception in the early 1980s, *The Link* has served as a daily prayer guide highlighting the influence of IPHC's World Missions Ministries. It has helped launch a global movement that is a powerful intercessory prayer force today, which I believe has been foundational to our success as a Missions Ministry.

In 2017, WMM accepted the ARISE 2033 challenge/vision to plant 5,000 new churches outside of the United States and establish an IPHC ministry presence in 50 new countries by 2033. Following that vision, WMM implemented six strategies throughout its 13 regions: 1. prayer, 2. evangelism or winning the lost, 3. discipling believers, 4. planting churches, 5. targeting the 7,626 unreached or unengaged ethnic groups in the world, and 6. changing a paradigm by challenging countries to become sending as opposed to receiving.

World Missions gives all glory to God for an increase of ministry into 27 countries since 2017 and a total of 5,248 new church plants, exceeding the ARISE 2033 goal for new church plants outside of the United States. With eight more years to go, WMM is praying for continued increase and ministry impact.

Join us in praying that Pentecostal Holiness Churches around the world will be awakened:

- by our vision and call to prayer
- to the urgency and need to reach the lost
- to their responsibility to disciple new believers
- and understand the importance and priority of planting new churches
- and understand that we have been commanded to Go and Make Disciples of all ethnic groups and that as believers of Christ Jesus, we are obligated to reach the unreached and unengaged
- and understand that with immigration demographics being what they are today, this is a "Kairos", or opportune moment, in time to position our existing 120 nations to become SENDING as opposed to RECEIVING nations

We must target the lost! We must establish soul-winning and discipleship as a priority!

Your intercessory investments are making the difference. Let's "*Continue steadfastly in prayer*" (Colossians 4:2) in 2026.

During their 16 years of missionary service in Belgium, Mauricio and Lulu Salazar shared the gospel with thousands of people and led hundreds to salvation, established two coffee houses in Brussels, started several cross-cultural international churches, founded and directed the Logos Bible School, and officially registered the IPHC in Belgium, now called CrossPoint Network. Though Mauricio Salazar entered his heavenly home on June 17, 2021, Lulu Salazar has continued the ministry in Belgium, focusing on working directly with CrossPoint in the areas of church planting, leadership development, and anti-human trafficking ministry.

David and Cecilia Hodges have served as full-time missionaries to Peru for 25 years. In 2007, they planted a flourishing church and a mission compound in Jicamarca, a mountainous desert region on the outskirts of Lima, Peru. In 2022, the Hodges started a floating mission movement called "Rivers of Fire" aboard a barge on the Amazon River. Since then, they have trained and engaged over 1,000 young leaders in ministry, reached over 120,000 people with the gospel, witnessed over 18,000 salvations, baptized nearly 2,000 people, and they pastor a local church. Their mission is to train every generation to represent the Kingdom in a real and whole way, being a relevant influence within the culture and society in which they live. Their vision raises men and women who dynamically, creatively, and powerfully live out and represent the Kingdom of God.

Misael and Daniela serve as church planters in Santa Cruz, Bolivia. Their heart and vision is to plant churches in major cities in Latinoamérica, targeting the professional and college student communities. 

Hope4Sudan offers hope through education, feeding programs, medical and eye clinics, clean water wells, discipleship training, planting churches, and an East Africa Bible College satellite campus. Founded by Lauren Pickens in 2007, Hope4Sudan began with kindergarten and 1st grade, one well, and a couple of buildings. God has grown this work to now include 17 buildings, which house Hope Church Kapoeta, the medical clinic, the K-8 primary school classrooms and offices, the kitchen, numerous ministries, including our new eye clinic, a missionary house, and tukuls to house missions teams and more. Gregory McClerkin, field director for this ministry, has led nationals to plant satellite Hope Churches in at least seven locations, with more planned. A second medical clinic recently opened in Kalipus. The mission of Hope4Sudan and its supporters is to show God's love by meeting the needs of His people. Visit hope4sudan.org to learn more.

Hope Center Ministries



Hope Center Ministries exists to lead addicts and their families to become fully devoted followers of Christ. We believe recovery is not just about getting sober, but about discovering a new life in Jesus. Through a structured program, residents work through challenges, address root issues, and move forward with lasting hope. With this hope, men and women rediscover who they are without the weight of their past holding them back. Using a recognized Christ-centered, 12-step model, residents find the joy of living and freedom in their everyday lives.

The goal is simple yet profound: to show that only the Word of God has the power to renew the mind. As you pray for residents in the program, we also ask you to remember those who continue into our Year Two Internship. These men and women feel called into ministry and often go on to serve as Directors, Recovery Pastors, Volunteer Counselors, and leaders within the local church.

Today, Hope Center Ministries is comprised of 51 centers across 13 U.S. states, along with active international centers in the U.K., Thailand, Belize, and Ukraine. Through World Missions partnerships, Hope Center has also assisted in recovery initiatives in Israel and Latvia.


