Lamentations 3:22-23 (NKJV) Through the Lord’s mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is thy faithfulness.

1 Corinthians 1:3 (NKJV) Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort...

Help me to be like You and be a Good Samaritan to anyone who needs help.
